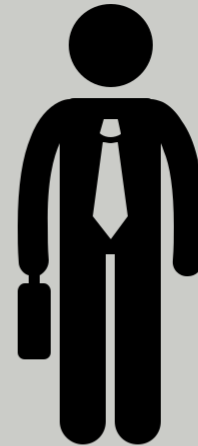

- ✗ I may not hold a practising certificate or professional indemnity insurance, meaning you are not protected or insured against any work I do that harms you or your business.
